

The Noyes Museum of Art of Stockton College Presents a New Teacher's Workshop: Telling a Story: *Illustrations* - with Artist Bill Ternay

This teacher's workshop will cover the art of storytelling through the use of sequential illustrations and a brief written story. Participants will write a very short story with a beginning, middle, and end that can be developed within the five illustrated panels of a storyboard. Students will do rough thumbnail sketches using tracing paper and pencils and develop their story. We will work on the composition within each of the five panels and the overall visual "flow" from beginning to end. This will be followed by a watercolor demonstration, a discussion of the unique qualities of the medium and a "finish" for one of the sketches. The emphasis will be more on showing and doing and less on telling.

The presenter is talented artist **Bill Ternay**, former Chairman of the Illustration Department at Moore College of Art and Past President of the Philadelphia Watercolor Society. Ternay is an accomplished illustrator, landscape and portrait painter (oils & watercolors), exceptional courtroom artist and Philadelphia muralist. <http://postcardsfromphilly.blogspot.com>

This will be an enjoyable workshop and a great opportunity to gather new ideas for enriching the curriculum, try some creative art activities and meet other teachers. Light morning refreshments and lunch included. The techniques covered in this workshop will work for K-12 students but are also sophisticated enough to be used by professional artists. All participants will receive handouts with instructions for the techniques involved, a list of art materials, and sources for these materials.
