

This Week in the Arts:

Two artists examine the concept of "the place in-between" - the moment between shifting realities - in "Transduction: Myths of the Sea and the Solar Boat," opening Thursday, Jan. 21, at The Noyes Museum of Art in Galloway Township.

The exhibit by internationally acclaimed artists Suzanne Reese Horvitz and Robert Roesch is a mystical installation of sculptures, large scale drawings, paintings, and works on glass.

Roesch, head of the sculpture department at the Pennsylvania Academy of Fine Art in Philadelphia, is intrigued by contrasting planes at their moment of intersection and the transference of energy between the two forces. His recent works include blue solar-powered lights that celebrate renewable energy and create solutions to our environmental situation. He contributes several large scale pieces to the exhibit that include metal sculpture and wall works.

Horvitz, meanwhile, offers a mythical narrative in her artwork. Her mixed media display is reverse painting, screening, sand blasting and gilding on glass, aluminum or canvas. Her newest work plays with formal balance by exploring the idea of mirror image and twins.

Their current exhibit can be viewed until May 23. The museum is open 10 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Tuesdays through Saturdays, and noon to 5 p.m. Sundays. The museum is located on Lily Lake Road in the Oceanville section of the township. Admission fees are \$4 adults, \$3 seniors and students. Call 609-652-8848.
